LENT MESSAGE

Dear Friends

Lent begins on Ash Wednesdav. 14th February this year. It can any fall time between February and 10th March moving according to the date of Easter Sunday which, general rule of thumb, comes on the first Sunday after the first moon after the spring equinox. This year, the chocolate eggs come super early, with Easter Sunday being the day before April Fool's Day dawns!

The rumour of Spring is whispered as we become aware of Lent approaching. This six week preparation for Easter consists of forty fast days, and six Sundays. Forty gives us clues about the origins of the practice – mirroring the time that Jesus spent alone immediately after his baptism. Of course, in the Gospels, Jesus didn't come hot-

foot from the desert into the hustle and bustle of Jerusalem for Holy Week. Instead, his Lent was the preparation for three years of travelling the highways and byways of Galilee, Samaria and Judea.

Liturgically, our Lent is the sharing of the journey towards Jerusalem just for that final Passover. The drama of palm leaves, fragrant nard, coins, broken bread and wine outpoured calls for our attention once again. The Via Dolorosa is ready to be laid anew. The garden tomb is waiting afresh to be filled. Some call Lent The Bright Sadness. The promise of Easter endures but in Lent we let lie veiled behind the it brokenness that Holy Week reenacts. This is why the Gloria is not sung, why alleluia is silenced in our services, why penitential



purple is the colour of the season.

Lent is a pilgrim path that leads inwards. The discipline of fasting is out of step with today's world. This is why it is such a doorway depths hidden into contemporary shallows. Taking time to become aware of our inner world is one of the joys and challenges of Lent. We tend to think of fasting in terms of food and drink, but fasting can be any abstinence deliberately chosen. "There's nothing magical about fasting. It's just one way of telling God that your priority at that moment is to be alone with him. sortina out whatever is necessarv. and vou have cancelled the meal. partv. concert, or whatever else you had planned to do in order to fulfil that priority" (J.I. Packer). This is why Lent is also a path that leads the pilgrim upwards, daring to approach the God who is present beyond the shallows.

If it to be a true fast however, Lent is a path that must lead its pilgrims outwards again. This is why so many resources for Lent encourage us with ideas for action on behalf of others:

"Here is the sort of fast I want — releasing those unjustly bound, untying the thongs of the yoke, letting the oppressed go free, breaking every yoke, sharing your food with the hungry, taking

the homeless poor into your house, clothing the naked when you see them. fulfilling your duty to your kinsmen!" (Isaiah 58:6-7) Those who have walked classical labyrinth know that the circuits of the pattern take us to the very centre and encourage us to linger there. However, the very same circuits of the pattern lead us outwards again. As Richard Foster writes, "our world is hungry for genuinely changed people" and so this Spring, may the disciplines of Lent "urge us to be the answer to a hollow world " Every blessing. Please note that timings may be subject to slight variations.





When the headmaster of Tujisaidie school in downtown Kayole said "Come and see our playground!" I wasn't at all sure what to expect. There were definitely not any green areas around here.

A large inside space with no windows was being whitewashed but to be honest it didn't look much like a playground to me. He, however was full of pride and enthusiasm about the works and I admired him for that. And now I can see why.

He had the vision. And he had imagination, wisdom, and creativity.

Now that vision has been realised, as the recent photo shows. The playground has been transformed and it looks wonderful, a space to truly be proud of. In a short video clip the children are as excited about their play area as their headmaster.

This is a Community school, built by local people in a very poor area. When primary education became compulsory in 2003 there simply weren't enough schools to accommodate everyone and many more were needed. The commitment to building schools, finding teachers and staff and the firm belief in the power of education to improve life chances is admirable.







How is our vision? Do we need glasses? The Optician can do a lot to help with our ability to see clearly but being a visionary is a different ball game. When the world seems full of sadness and grief we can be encouraged by those with a realistic vision of something that can truly affect people's lives and happiness. Let's try and emulate them.

OUTDOOR WORSHIP AT THE CATHEDRAL



At 3pm on the first Sunday of each month and 10am-12pm on the third Saturday of the month Worship in the Garden: meeting with God in creation.

Starting in January, Worcester Cathedral will be launching a new, monthly service of worship.

What makes it a little unusual is that it will not take place inside the cathedral. Instead, we will be outside, come rain or shine. The vision is to develop a service that focuses on worship of the Creator in creation, with creation, and aware of ourselves as a part of creation. So we will be paying attention to, and respond to, what is happening around us in the garden as the seasons change.

The hope is to develop a pattern

of creation-attuned worship that brings into focus those many aspects of the Bible and Christian tradition that celebrate the natural rhythms of the world, and the goodness of fields and rives, trees and plants, and all creatures, great and small.

Our service will have a traditional shape—with liturgical prayers and Bible readings. for instance—but will pay special attention to the theme of creation as it connects to all aspects of Christian spirituality. A little more unusually we will give regular space to silence and to hands-on engaging with the space around (e.g., doing us some gardening).

Worship in the Garden will not be for everyone, but if you find that vou connect with God when outdoors it might be right up your street. Evervone is welcome. We will meet at 3pm on the first Sunday of each month in the garden behind 15b (off College entering through Green. doorway outside the Edgar Tower Gate). SACRED GARDEN: engaging with God in creation through creativity

Sacred Garden is a new monthly event that Worcester Cathedral is launching for people who feel God's presence when they're out in nature. Our goal is to create and cultivate a time and space in which people can engage with the Creator in creation through using their creativity.

Each month there will be a particular theme and then the opportunity to explore it in a range of ways. There will always be four different 'stations' with guided activities that people can choose from. Those will be:

- A silent contemplation zone (which people can stay in for as long or short a time as they wish)
- An art activity
- A kinesthetic/making activity

(e.g., wood chopping and whittling)
A gardening activity of a seasonally relevant kind

We aim to foster a welcoming and hospitable space for people to explore their own ecospirituality in a Christian context. People of all faiths and none are most welcome.

We will meet from 10am to 12pm on the third Saturday of each month in the garden behind 15b (off College Green, entering through the doorway outside the Edgar Tower Gate). Our first meeting will take place on 20 January.

PLEASE NOTE: There will be a peal of bells taking place throughout the first gathering. If you are sensitive to loud noise you may prefer to wait until our February event.
